



Indianapolis Alumni Chapter Health Inventory Results

The Indianapolis Alumni Chapter's (IAC) Healthy Kappas Committee conducted a health care study for brothers. This initiative was developed to better understand healthcare issues most relevant to IAC members. A health care inventory questionnaire was developed and distributed to brothers inquiring about various aspects of individual and family health diagnoses and concerns. Insights from the study revealed opportunities to increase awareness on decreasing blood pressure, diabetes, mental health, and the importance of annual physicals. The committee will conduct studies annually to assess chapter health status, compare year to year changes, and determine if chapter health initiatives were achieved.

Province Parliamentarian Article

Parliamentary Boot Camp

Issue #2 - Rules of Engagement

In 1911, the Founders of Kappa Alpha Psi chose *Robert's Rules of Order* which introduced standards of operations that discouraged individual decisions on how to conduct business and encouraged collective cooperation to resolve issues during local, provincial, or Grand Chapter Sessions. In order for the now 12th Edition of Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised (RONR) to be properly used, every participating brother should understand its

basic fundamentals which are founded in fairness and justice.

In Kappa, there are eleven recognized fundamentals of basic and fair Parliamentary Law:

- The organization is paramount. It holds the power. Its intent and conveniences supersede any individual member.
- 2. One proposal or issue before the assembly at a time.
- 3. Full discussion before action is decided and executed.
- 4. Keep all debates impersonal as well as logical. A brother is never to be called "out of order." His formal proposal or his actions may be ruled by the Chairman as inappropriate, illegal, or out of order but in Kappa Alpha Psi, brothers show respect for each other on and off the Floor of the Assembly regardless of if different points of view are held.
- 5. Matters affecting the privileges or emergency needs of the assembly or that of an individual member can interrupt business.
- Once a "Motion to Suspend" is introduced on the Floor, there can be no discussion from the Floor for suspensions or necessary interruptions of business.
- 7. Motions proposing the suspension of the rules may not be debated.
- 8. An issue or proposal may not be introduced a second time in the same form at the same meeting unless there is a motion introduced to "reconsider actions already taken."
- The majority decides, usually. The Body decides all issues. However, it requires more than a majority to limit a member's parliamentary rights to introduce, discuss, vote, suspend or modify without prior notice.
- 10. A two-thirds (2/3^{rds}) majority vote is required for extraordinary issues before the assembly such as amending the bylaws or to change or appeal without notice a motion previously adopted, suspending the rules, or restricting the rights of members.
- 11. Silence indicates consent and agreement. A decision not to vote *is a vote* for the prevailing side.

To notify IHQ of a deceased brother:

- 2. Look for Member Support on page.
- 3. Under Member Support, click on The Chapter Invisible link.
- 4. Chapter Invisible Form appears on screen.
- 5. Enter information on deceased brother into form.
- 6. Ensure accuracy of entered information.
- 7. Select Submit Form button after review of information.
- Automated notification is sent to requester's email address confirming IHQ's receipt of Chapter Invisible.
- 9. No phone calls or emails to IHQ are required when using this process
- 10. When submitting a Chapter Invisible article to the Kappa Alpha Psi® Journal, please:
- 11. Keep the article length to maximum of 700 words.
- 12. Attach headshot photo(s) of brother with a minimum of 300dpi resolution when submitting article.

- 13. Do not submit a copy of the obituary as the article to the Journal.
- 14. The obituary should be the basis of the article.
- 15. Outside sources such as newspaper or magazine articles can be used.
- 16. NOTE: Be careful not to plagiarize when using an outside source.
- 17. Submit article in a Microsoft® Word document file
- 18. Write in paragraph format and check for grammar and spelling errors.
